

Sourcing Core Training for Practitioners within the Early Years and Childcare Sector

The Childcare Partnerships have invested in providing core training for early years and childcare practitioners for many years.

It is the intention that this service will continue into the future but due to limited resources, it is increasingly likely that the Childcare Partnerships will only be able to provide 1 or possibly 2 places per setting. It is therefore probable that on occasions early years and childcare practitioners/providers will have to source training elsewhere. To assist you in doing this, we have compiled the following guidelines.

Guidelines

To ascertain what training is required providers should refer to the Minimum Standards for Childminding and Day Care for Children Under Age 12 (DHSS&PS 2012). This document can be downloaded using the following link:

The minimum Standards for Daycare and Childminding for children under age 12 have been developed to provide assurance of a consistent level of quality in registered childcare services and also ensure a consistent regional approach to registration and inspection. Health and Social Care (HSC) Trusts are responsible for registering and inspecting these services against the requirements as set out in the Children (Northern Ireland) Order 1995:

The Registering Authority HSC Trusts Early Years Team will ultimately have to be satisfied that any training undertaken meets the required standards.

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Childminders are not required to have a Certificate in Fire Safety training; however, Childminders will be required to complete a Fire Safety Risk Assessment as part of the Registration requirements. If a Childminder requires

advice about completing a Fire Safety Risk Assessment, advice can be sought from the Registering Social Worker or their local Childminding Development Officer.
